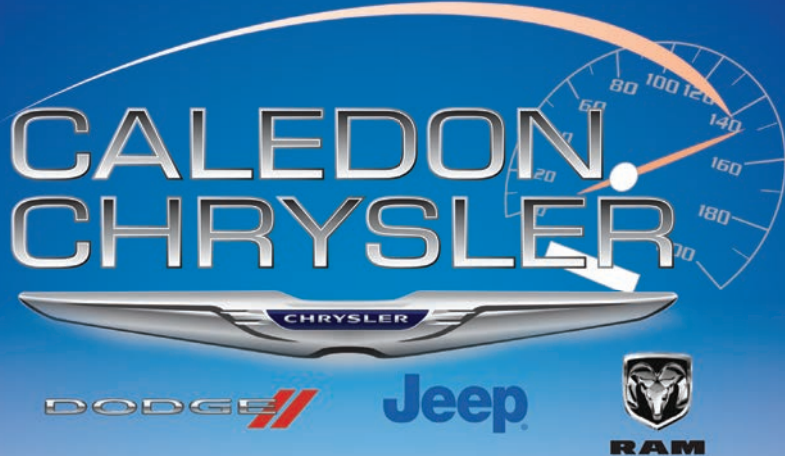

## New school in Caledon will hold 600 students

SouthFields Village Public School is at capacity, and the Province is stepping in to help with funding.

Education Minister Mitzi Hunter was at the school Tuesday to announce the Province will be providing \$12.7 million for a new school nearby to take off some of the load.

"This is a wonderful announcement today for the Caledon community," she remarked.

Trustee Stan Cameron, Caledon's representative of

the Peel District School Board, said land is currently being eyed northwest of SouthFields Village, and negotiations to acquire the property are nearing completion.

It's 13 acres east of Highway 10, south of Old School Road and west of Kennedy Road. No name has yet been chosen for the new school.

He also observed the school currently houses 1,000 students and there are already 12 portable classrooms on the site.

"We're not happy having 12 portables here," Cameron commented.

Hunter said the plan is to build a "state-of-the-art new elementary school" that will accommodate 650 students.

"This is a sound investment for students and their families," she remarked, adding it's also an investment in the community.

Hunter also commented the government has invested some \$14 billion in school infrastructure since

2003, resulting in more than 760 new schools.

This project is seen as part of the largest investment in public infrastructure in Ontario's history, amounting to about \$160 billion over 12

years. This is helping to support some 110,000 jobs annually with projects like roads,

## Caledon bans all outdoor burning

There is currently a ban on all outdoor burning in the Town of Caledon

It took effect last week, and Deputy Fire Chief Darryl Bailey said Tuesday it will remain in effect until further notice.

Caledon Fire and Emergency Service reported the lack of precipitation and extremely dry conditions have combined to the point where firefighting operations on grass, brush, bush, etc. could be extremely dangerous for firefighters and may place properties at high risk.

The ban was issued pursuant to the Fire Protection and Prevention Act and the Ontario Fire Code. Contravention could result in a minimum fine of \$300 and a minimum invoice of \$691 per fire truck per hour for all firefighting costs.

# Lockout Friday morning may end postal service

If you have mail you want to send, now is definitely not the time to do it. Canada Post issued a 72-hour notice warning Tuesday morning that its unionized employees could be locked out as of Friday morning.

Just after midnight Tuesday, Canada Post sent out a press release notifying the public of the lockout following failed negotiations with the Canadian Union of Postal Workers (CUPW).

“The uncertainty caused by the prolonged negotiations and the union’s strike mandate is having a negative and escalating impact on the postal service,” the release stated.

As of tomorrow (Friday), Canada Post will change the terms and conditions of employment for all employees represented by CUPW, as the old collective agreements no longer apply. Under the new terms and conditions, Canada Post said their employees will continue to receive their regular pay, as well as some benefits like prescription drug coverage.

“The corporation must now respond to the rapidly deteriorating volumes and the financial impact to the business, using the means provided in the Canada Labour Code.”

This means that some items, which were under the previous collective agreements, have been cancelled to line up with the minimum conditions established under the labour code. Another change includes Canada Post’s ability to adjust staffing according to the amount of work they feel is required.

Canada Post told CUPW Monday that its offers, which had been presented June 25, are to be considered final, as they felt

they represented “a fair and reasonable framework for settlements.”

Although the 72-hour lockout notice has been provided, Canada Post iterated this does not necessarily mean the business will not be operating Friday.

Following the announcement from Canada Post, CUPW issued a statement accusing the corporation of driving the workers “out onto the streets without pay” in order to force them to accept steep concessions being imposed.

“We knew this was their game all along,” said CUPW President Mike Palecek. “They are sabotaging the public review of the post office. They refused to negotiate fairly with us and now they’re locking the doors and will try to starve us into submission.”

CUPW portrayed much of its negotiations as involving an attempt to get pay equity for its female-dominated workforce, as well as staff off the company’s demands for massive rollbacks.

Currently, female postal workers earn 28 per cent less than their male counterparts, according to the union.

The union said that since the negotiations began, Canada Post tabled only one offer, and would not budge on its details throughout the talks. Now, the company is warning they may shut down the postal service, blaming the move on its workers.

In 2011, Canada Post locked out postal workers following failed negotiations for their contract renewals at that time. The Conservative government forced workers back to work using legislation that has been called by some experts unconstitutional, imposing a four-year collective agreement on CUPW.

According to Canada Post, the union’s

demands are unaffordable, costing it more than \$1 billion. In sticking to its June 25 offer, it cited “rapidly deteriorating volumes and the financial impact” to the business as the basis for the lockout.

While Canada Post said it cannot maintain a profit and meet the demands of the postal workers, President and CEO Deepak Chopra won a new five-year contract from the Conservative government in 2014, giving him a salary of \$500,000 per year. It is estimated he also receives upwards of \$400,000 in bonuses annually, with other upper-level management also receiving six-figure salaries.

In a press conference Tuesday, Palecek countered claims the dispute was about pensions, citing the lower earnings of female employees and the fact that workers responsible for delivering packages are not paid beyond 6.5-hour shifts, even if the parcel volume is far higher.

Rather than being paid for their actual time on the road, CUPW said the workers are paid \$1 per package delivered outside of the set shift hours.

“They have been lying to the public,” Palecek charged.

He added that another lie is about the profitability of the Crown Corporation. Despite claims by Canada Post that profits are decreasing, outside critics have said the company has seen an increasing profit over the past 22 years. Palecek said the company turned a \$100-million profit last year, and appears to be expecting higher profits. So far, Canada Post has refused to open its books to the union.

At a press conference in Quebec Tuesday, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said the government did not intend to take action on the impending lockout.

“We do not feel, unlike previous governments, that it is the immediate responsibility to be heavy-handed,” he said. “We respect labour. We respect the need to come to terms at the bargaining table and that is what we are going to continue to work on.”

At press time, Canada Post had not provided warnings of an impending lockout to customers on their website’s homepage, or anywhere other than its media page.

bridges, transit systems, schools and hospitals.

“Our government is proud to invest in capital projects like this new school in Caledon that supports students by giving them new, modern facilities and greater opportunities to learn in a high-quality environment,” Hunter added.

“This is a great opportunity to really provide thanks and celebrate great, great news,” Board Director of Education Tony Pontes declared.

Cameron also said they are hoping to have the school ready to receive students in September 2017.

“That’s the target date,” he said.

He also said the school, which will have students from junior kindergarten to Grade 8, will draw youngsters from SouthFields Village and Valleywood, as well as some from north Brampton. There won’t be any students coming from Mayfield West, he added. Cameron said that community will be getting its own elementary and secondary schools in time.

# CCS unveils name of new store

Chez Thrift is about to change, in terms of both location and name.

Dignitaries and supporters of Caledon Community Services (CCS) were on hand last week at the new planned location on Industrial Road in Bolton for the construction launch. They also saw the unveiling of the new name — evolve.

“Today is an exciting day for CCS,” Board member Johanna Downey told those assembled.

The new store for reselling gently used clothing and other donated items will have about 15,000 square feet, more than doubling the current location.

Downey said the new name is appropri-

ate, as it means “to work through a process to achieve change.”

She also said Chez Thrift has been accepting donated clothing for years, providing revenue for many of CCS’s projects. But there’s not enough space at the current location for the sorting of contributions etc.

The store made about \$750,000 in revenue last year, and that all went back into the community.

“I know with the right tools we can do better,” Downey said.

“It’s going to be magnificent,” CCS Board Chair Carine Strong declared. “We’re going to be able to help so many in the community.”

OPP last month warned the public about an ongoing Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) scam that is running rampant throughout Ontario.

It has now come to the attention of OPP that their Provincial Communications Centres are being inundated with calls from the public advising that they received one of these calls pretending to be from CRA. It is not necessary to contact police to report having received one of these calls unless one is a victim of fraud that can be attributed to this scam.

Now that summer is here, it's a great time for bike riding in Caledon.

Caledon OPP are reminding all cyclists that a bicycle is a vehicle under the Highway Traffic Act. That means cyclists are expected to obey all traffic laws, and understand that they have the same rights and responsibilities as drivers.

If the bike is designed for one person, cyclists cannot carry passengers.

Keep in mind that the Ministry of Transportation recommends that children under the age of 10 should not ride on the road.

Police have tips for people who are riding on the road.

- Ride one meter from the curb or from parked cars to have enough space to avoid hazards.
- Be visible to motorists by riding in a straight line on the right hand side of the road.

This website will provide an online means of reporting and offers great tips to avoid becoming a victim of this or any other fraud.

Police report some of the Communications Centres are receiving upwards to 100 or more calls per day from people wanting to advise that they received one of these scam-related calls. Although they

- Look for drivers changing lanes, exiting from driveways and parking lots to avoid being struck.
- Ride in the direction of traffic.
- Never share a lane with a large vehicle such as a truck or bus.
- When changing lanes, remember that vehicles in the other lane of traffic have the right-of-way; this means that the person moving into the new lane must wait for an opening.
- Cross railway tracks so that the tires are at a 90-degree angle to the railway track. This will prevent the wheel from catching in the track, which could make the rider fall or damage the bicycle wheels.
- Lastly, avoid all distractions while cycling, like listening to music with headphones or ear buds, or using a cellular phone. Be attentive, keep eyes on the road, and ride with the wind — open and free!

appreciate the intentions behind people reporting these calls, it is these calls which are at times restricting OPP's ability to take calls for service from the public that require a police response.

Caledon OPP reports catching a driver going well over the posted speed limit June 4.

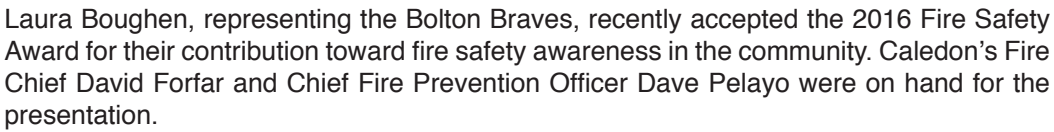
Police stated an officer was conducting radar enforcement on Creditview Road, north of Old School Road when he spotted a black 2013 Mercedes-Benz traveling at high speed. The officer determined the speed to be 194 km/h in a posted 80 zone, or 114 over the limit.

A 38-year-old man from Caledon was charged with racing a motor vehicle. His licence was suspended for seven days on the spot, and the car was impounded for seven days.

Police say driving 50 or more km/h over the posted speed limit is one of the most serious and reckless forms of aggressive driving. They support street racing/stunt driving legislation and other legislation aimed at saving lives and taking drivers who engage in these high-risk actions off the road.

A study conducted by Western University and the Ministry of Transportation revealed that there are approximately 58 per cent fewer speed-related deaths and injuries a month, particularly for young males, since the law took effect in 2007.



From July 1 to 3, Caledon OPP took part in a province-wide traffic safety initiative.

During the initiative, OPP officers focused their attention on aggressive driving, as well as the other “Big 4” causes of injuries in collisions: speeding, impaired driving, distracted driving, and seat belts.

The Caledon figures show there were four people charged with distracted driving, 217 with speeding; eight with racing; six with seat belt infractions; three with impaired driving; three who were handed warn-range suspensions; and 134 who were charged with other offences.

Police remind motorists to be mindful of their driving behaviour while travelling.

Two students are facing charges after what Caledon OPP are calling a prank at a local high school.

Police report they were called to the school May 30 after two students had apparently gone into a stairwell and released a noxious substance. This act resulted in damage to school property and the building had to be evacuated.

Caledon Fire and Emergency Services

also responded. The youths were charged with mischief under \$5,000. Police are reminding students that as the end of the school year approaches, they should still behave responsibly. Schools are not only a place for learning and development, but also an environment where all individuals should feel safe from harm and danger.

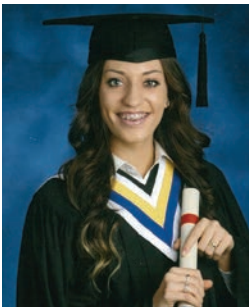

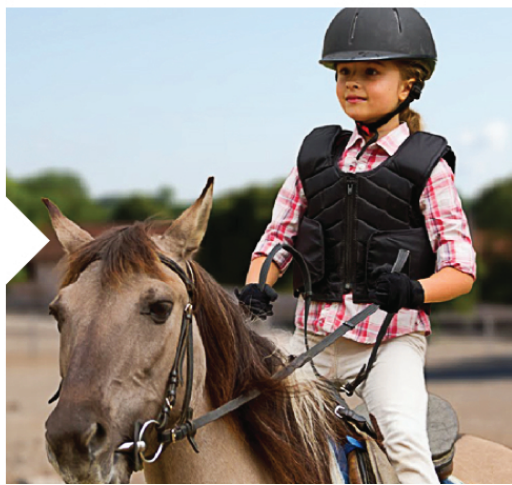

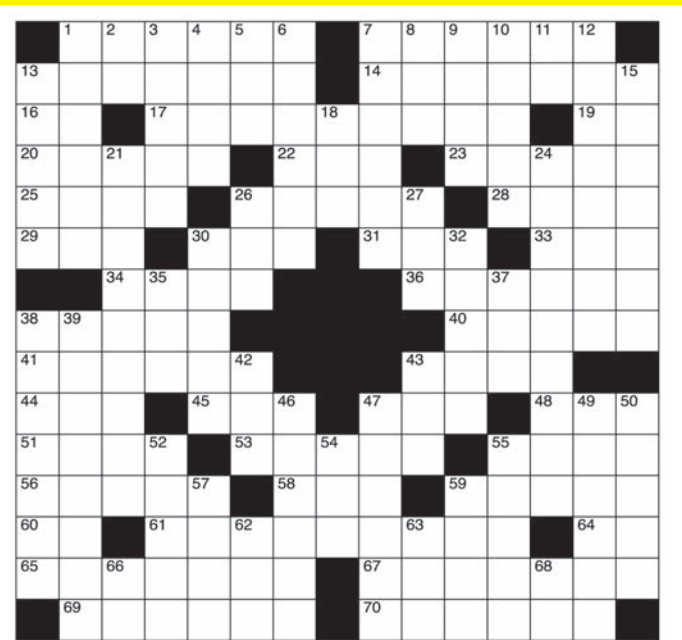

## Government backs down on removing children from accessing IBI therapy

When the provincial government announced their new Autism Program March 29, it included removing children older than five from receiving Intensive Behavioural Intervention (IBI) therapy. As a result of this decision, approximately 3,500 children who were on a wait list or were receiving therapy became ineligible for IBI therapy.

My Progressive Conservative colleagues, led by Patrick Brown, and I immediately began to hear from families across Ontario. Many parents spoke of the benefits their child experienced from receiving IBI therapy even after the age of five. Over the course of the spring session at the Ontario Legislature, both opposition parties called on the government to reverse their decision. In addition, individuals, organizations and municipalities across the province voiced their opposition to the government's announcement.

After three months of pressure and a new Minister, the provincial government recently announced changes to their new Autism Program, including backing down on their controversial decision to remove children older than five from accessing IBI therapy. No longer will a child be removed from receiving this life-changing therapy simply because of how old they are. Other changes announced by the Minister include shortening the timeline for implementing the new program by a year from 2018 to 2017, as well as ensuring children older than five who were on the waitlist for IBI therapy will receive the necessary supports until the new pro-

gram is in place.

As the Progressive Conservative critic for Children and Youth services, I am pleased the new Minister of Children and Youth Services listened to our concerns. We owe it to our province's future generations to ensure they are provided every

## Tony Clement 'no dim bulb'

It must be really difficult to be a genius while so many people around you are complete idiots.

Just look at the sad plight of all those brilliant elitists from the political-academic-media-business class who are being forced to cope with the fact that the British public — or, more to the point, the great unwashed among them — actually voted in favour of leaving the European Union (EU) and taking their chances as an independent nation once again.

"How could they be so stupid?" cry the elites. How could they possibly have not taken the best advice and voted to leave the bureaucratic nirvana being run out of Brussels?

Yes, indeed, they moan, this is what happens when you are stupid enough, as then prime minister David Cameron was, to actually ask people their opinion on an important matter. It's not as if the people know anything, for heaven's sake. Why not just take your advice from the elite and carry on?

As veteran left-leaning backroom boy Robin V. Sears put it in his Saturday Star piece on the Brexit vote, "In a functioning representative democracy, referenda are almost always a bad idea. They necessarily reduce complex policy choice to a light switch. They never unite, but divide — nations, communities and, painfully, families."

I've known Clement for several decades, and whatever one thinks of his politics he is certainly no dim bulb. I suspect he could cite Burke and others in greater depth than Sears, but then, how would Sears know that since he clearly

didn't bother to ask Clement before suggesting Burke was far too advanced for Clement and his ilk.

But then, when you're as smart as Sears deems himself to be, there is no need to ask. You simply know these things.

The dire predictions of doom and gloom mirrored the same fear-mongering used by the Canadian elite mob to convince us to accept Brian Mulroney's Meech Lake Accord years ago. Once again, the simpletons prevailed, yet despite warnings about the end of Canada as we know it, we still seem to be muddling along okay.

Yes, there will be disruptions over Brexit. There already have been significant swings in the stock market and elsewhere. But it's too will pass, just as it did in Canada.

In addition to labelling the "leave" voters as idiots — not to mention racists and other unsavoury things — the latest tack is to opine that the vote doesn't really matter anyway because the Brits are staying.

"As nations, we must do better. We must remember those who have been left behind in our incredible success and growth. And we must take steps to rectify the disconnect."

Then again, Watt is a Conservative. So what does he know?

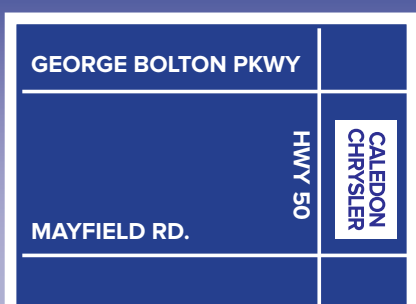

Underhill was first to go in the second round, and she and Count Me in made it over all the jumps in 44.62 seconds. That time was good enough for the win.

Underhill was quick to agree it was a tough course, with 16 jumps. It was quickly realized that time was going to be a factor, and the officials increased the time allowed on course from 90 to 93 seconds after the first three competitors had gone.

She also pointed out they used a number of the colourful jumps that had been employed during last year's Pan American Games, and the horses weren't used to them.

She observed that going first in the jump-off is difficult, because the other riders know what they have to beat.

"You have to try and anticipate the horses coming behind you," she explained.

Underhill had few complaints about her main mount Sunday.

"He's a fantastic horse, and wonderful owners," she said.

She said this is the third season she's been competing with the nine-year-old Hanoverian, so he's not had a lot of experience at this level of competition. But she knows he works hard and tries his
