Few changes as Regional Council passes budget for 2018

After some lengthy presentations, it didn't take long for Peel Regional Council to pass a budget for 2018 last Thursday.

It contains a Regional net tax levy increase of 2.6 per cent. This represents a 1.0 per cent property tax increase and a 6.5 per cent utility rate increase. This ing. will result in an annual increase to the average residential property and small business property tax bills of \$47 and \$85 respectively. Additionally, the average home will see a \$41 increase to their utility bill, while the average small business will see an increase of \$99.

"The Region's annual budget process involves serious discussion and prudent and responsible decision making," Regional Chair Frank Dale said. 2017 Tax Assistance Program for Low Income Seniors and Persons with Disabilities

To provide financial assistance to low-income elderly homeowners and low-income persons with disabilities, Town of Caledon By-law 2015-019 allows for a residential property tax credit of \$468 subject to the following conditions.

To qualify, the property owner or spouse of the owner must:

FOR SENIORS:

- Be 65 years of age or older by the application date; and
- Be in receipt of the monthly guaranteed income supplement as provided under the Old Age Security Act (Canada); and
- Be continuously assessed as the owner and reside on residential real property within the Town of Caledon for a period of not less than one year immediately preceding the application date.

FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES:

- Be in receipt of benefits under the Ontario Disability Support Program Act (ODSPA); and
- Be continuously assessed as the owner and reside on residential real property within the Town of Caledon for a period of not less than one year immediately preceding the application date.

In addition, all owners of the property must either be a qualifying senior or qualifying person with disabilities or their spouse.

This residential property tax rebate, where allowed, will be an outright grant made by the Town and will not entail repayment of any kind. Application forms may be obtained at Town Hall, or by calling 905.584.2272 x. 4216, or by visiting the Town's website at caledon.ca/taxhelp.

you are shopping for an SUV or crossover, you're not alone. According to the latest industry stats from DesRosiers Automotive Consultants, light truck sales continue to outpace passenger cars, accounting for more than two-thirds of the Canadian market. And the margin is growing.

Okay, the light truck category also includes pickups - which are flying out of showrooms - and minivans, which are not. But keep in mind that although four of the five top-selling vehicles, overall, are pickup trucks, nearly half of the top-20 are sport utilities and crossovers*.

In particular, the small ones – more on that later. SUVs are broadly defined as being based on a truck platform (body-on-frame), with high ground clearance and four- or all-wheel-drive. And they've been around longer than you may think.

Their history dates back to the post-WWII period, with names like the Willy's Jeep Station Wagon, Land Rover Series I and II, and International Harvester Scout still resonating with collectors and enthusiasts. But the rest of us are probably more familiar with the later, and more common models like Ford Bronco, Chevy Blazer, Suburban, and the first-generation Toyota Land Cruiser.

These were the bruisers that dominated, before the term "sport utility vehicle" was coined in the late 1980s. Big, thirsty, and with serious off-road ability, they were questionable daily drivers, yet garnered a large and loyal following. Some, like the original Land Cruiser, still fetch considerable dollars despite their vintage.

I won't agonize over who launched the first modern SUV - we'll leave that debate to the gearheads - but it came about when gas was cheap, and the station wagon was in a sorry state.

Indeed, the faux woodgrain-wrapped Ford Country Squires, Buick Roadmasters and other rust-prone crap from the seventies and eighties ensured there would be buyers interested in a better solution for hauling people and cargo.

And when it came, the early Toyota 4Runners, Jeep Cherokees and Ford Explorers caught the attention of buyers who might otherwise have settled for a wagon - or a small pickup truck.

Much has happened since then to spur the design of so many new models and variations, not to mention a quantum shift in buying. Smaller families,

skyrocketing gas prices, and changing tastes have all made their mark.

On the latter point, although buyers initially fell in love with the ruggedness of a truck-based SUV, they fell out of love with its relatively coarse ride and handling. Hence, the crossover (or CUV) was born. It unibody structure and car-based suspension and underpinnings ensured more civilized driving dynamics, without giving up cargo room, all-wheel-drive, and a commanding view of the road.

Purists will argue the AMC Eagle of the 1970s and 1980s was the first "modern" crossover. But I'm not a purist and will point out that the Eagle was long gone by the time the need for a CUV surfaced, and the segment was created.

So let's talk about Toyota RAV4, Honda CR-V, Subaru Forester - and the Nissan Murano that followed. These are worth mentioning because they were well-designed and continue to sell in big numbers. And they pioneered the segment.

Like SUVs, CUVs come in small, medium and large sizes. Although the current trend is to go smaller. Many buyers are realizing they don't need a 'school bus', and can enjoy the benefits of each on a smaller footprint.

One that is less thirsty.

Indeed, small is becoming big business and when you look at sales rankings of all 101 SUVs and CUVs available in Canada - yes, there are that many! All of the top five are compact or subcompact*.

In the "subcompact" class, you'll find Buick Encore, Chevrolet Trax, Fiat 500X, Honda HR-V, Mazda CX-3, Mini Countryman, Nissan Juke, Nissan Qashqai and Subaru XV Crosstrek.

The "compact" class is even larger: Buick Envision, Chevrolet Equinox, Dodge Journey, Ford Escape, GMC Terrain, Honda CR-V, Hyundai Tucson, Jeep Cherokee, Jeep Compass, Jeep Patriot, Kia Sportage, Mazda CX-5, Mitsubishi Outlander, Nissan Rogue, Subaru Forester, Toyota RAV4 and Volkswagen Tiguan.

Whether you're buying small or mid-sized, automakers are moving away from V6 engines and embracing the inline four. Especially the turbocharged four cylinders that are offering the same or more horsepower, with better fuel economy.

Naturally-aspirated four cylinder engines (no turbo) and smaller turbo fours are typically found in subcompacts, with horsepower ratings in the 130-190 range. They are not meant for serious hauling, but



some will tow personal watercraft and small trailers.

Larger compacts like Outlander, Equinox and Escape can tow up to 3,500 pounds, when properly equipped. Midsize offerings like Toyota 4Runner, Ford Explorer and Honda Pilot are a better option for towing, able to pull 5,000 lbs, with Durango maxing out at 7,200. But that's with a V8.

In the mid-size class, SUVs and crossovers not only have more muscle, but some even have three rows of seating. The back bench typically won't match the leg room of a minivan, but these seats will work for kids and shorter adults. Check out vehicles like Traverse, 4Runner, Pilot, Explorer, Santa Fe XL, CX-9, Pathfinder and others if you need to carry seven or eight occupants.

Full-size models are still best for moving big families – and all their stuff. With all three rows of seating upright, some still have loads of cargo room behind. Chevy Suburban, for example, can comfortably carry eight passengers along with 1,112 litres of space for groceries or gear.

No surprise that it also packs a V8 under the hood, as do Toyota Sequoia and GMC Yukon. Ford Expedition employs a twin-turbocharged 3.5-litre V6, but it outperforms many eight cylinder engines with its 365 hp and 420 lb/ft of torque.

You might think that SUV and CUV pricing closely follows size, and you'd be partially correct. Some of the small, entry models start in the mid \$20K range, while full-size SUVs can hit the wallet at two to three times that, plus options.

Yet many of the smaller rides offer premium features like heated steering wheel, heated rear seats,

leather upholstery, premium infotainment systems, and a full suite of driver aids like radar cruise control, adaptive front lighting and lane-keeping assist. These can drive pricing upwards of \$40,000.

Buyers with bigger budgets can explore even more posh offerings. Here, you'll find marques like BMW, Mercedes-Benz, Audi, Lexus, Infiniti, Lincoln, Cadillac, Land Rover and others who produce vehicles that rival the best luxury sedans in terms of build quality, technology and comfort.

Features like seat cooling and massage, self parking and other semi-autonomous technology are available on certain models, not to mention leather seating and premium audio systems that rival - or outclass - what many people have in their homes.

And although most of these vehicles will never face anything more challenging than cottage roads, some like Land Rover/Range Rover, Mercedes G-Class and even Porsche Cayenne boast significant off-road cred. You may question the sanity of going rock crawling with a \$100K-plus vehicle, but it's possible with some of these!

So do your research – after all, this is a big investment - and be sure to get ample seat time. Remember that although you may have high expectations of your SUV or CUV in terms of towing, hauling or offroading, it is probably also your daily driver. You don't have to sacrifice comfort for capability. With the many advancements in ride technology, even the burliest of today's rides now have excellent road manners.







There's no difference if you have snow tires put on and the temperature goes back up. Snow tires actually work better in wet conditions as well," Amar said.

Amar referred to a Toronto Star investigative article that explains there is no real difference any more between name brand tires and off-shore produced tires. The quality is pretty well matched and the pricing is very competitive.

VOLVO turns up the heat on V90 flagship wagon

olvo wagons have come light years since the boxy rides I grew up with. Like the long-running 200 series that spanned the 1970s to 1990s, and the even more sharp-edged 700 series of the 1980s.

All were stoutly-built, and some even fast, but aside from a brief appearance of the sleek 1800ES more than four decades ago, the word "sexy" was seldom used to describe a Volvo.

The current lineup, however, has seen the Swedish automaker shed its brick-like ways, with the latest example being its V90 flagship wagon.

At nearly five metres long and two metres wide, the V90 is a large vehicle, having the same footprint as its beefy 90-Series sibling – the three-row XC90 sport utility. But with a much lower stance and wide tires pushed to the corners, the V90 doesn't look like your typical family hauler.

Indeed, its chiseled features, protruding wheel arches, broad shoulders and sloping roofline (with steeply-raked rear hatch), delivers a look of elegance and athleticism - on par with the S90 sedan.

Maybe even more so.

And it provides a heck of a lot more cargo room: 723 litres with the seats up, and enough for a pair of mountain bikes when folded flat. Which can be done by the push of a button at the rear hatch opening.

If this sounds like I'm a fan of the wagon - guilty as charged. Wagons, in general, are a crisper handling, more fuel efficient and easier-to-park alternative to the ubiquitous SUV. And although North American automakers killed this segment by the mid 1990s, following a long history of crappy product, such wasn't the case overseas. European automakers continue to deliver stellar options like BMW 3 Series Touring, Audi A4 allroad Quattro, Volvo V60 and my tester for the week, the V90 R-Design with optional "Polestar" optimization.

More on that shortly.

Pricing for the V90 starts at \$59,900 for the Momentum model, \$64,450 for the R-Design, and \$66,050 for Inscription. And, of course, a load of packages and options to amp up pricing.

All vehicles get a turbocharged and supercharged 2.0-litre engine, mated to an eight-speed "Geartronic" automatic transmission and electronicallycontrolled all-wheel-drive.

You may scoff at the idea of four cylinders powering a luxury auto - especially one this large. Even with 316 hp and 295 lb/ft of torque, you can't discount the V90's nearly two tons of steel and rubber.

Nonetheless, it will sprint from zero to 100 km/h in just 6.1 seconds. And my tester, which received the \$1,400 Polestar package - computer chipped to 330 hp and 325 lb/ft of torque – will get there even faster.

The Polestar badge is not yet as well known as Mercedes' AMG or BMW's M divisions, but it is Volvo's performance arm that currently sells the S60 and V60 Polestar - a track-ready, 367-hp sedan and wagon that I've had the pleasure to drive here, and across Sweden.

These road rockets will change your mind about Volvo's historically prim personality.

But not everybody wants the stiff suspension and dialed-in driving dynamics, so engineers have incorporated some Polestar elements into an already potent V90 R-Design to give it a more aggressive driv-

ing character – on demand.

This, you can tailor via one of three drive modes: Eco, Comfort and Dynamic, with the latter being my go-to setting for much of the week. Spin the knurled chrome roller to select it, and throttle response quickens, steering tightens and the transmission remaps for later gear changes and quicker shifts.

The powertrain itself may seem overly complex, but it nearly eliminates initial lag. Punch the pedal and the mechanically-driven supercharger instantly force-feeds air to the fuel mixture. In the background, the exhaust-driven turbocharger spins up to deliver even more.

Indeed, the V90 launches briskly and provides ample power when you need it - no 'white-knuckling' when pulling out to pass. And despite all the commotion under the hood, this powertrain is smooth and the cabin is hushed, with only a delightful whine from the supercharger running at full boil.

When you're not behaving like an auto journalist, the V90 is reasonably thrifty. Fuel numbers are 10.8/7.6/9.4 litres per 100 km (city/hwy/comb), most likely in Eco mode, where I spent little time.

My tester also had the rear air suspension with active chassis. This \$2,350 standalone option is brilliant at quieting bumps, potholes and other road imperfections, and at the same time allows the big wagon to carve corners like a sports sedan.

Inside, V90 is fitted with the premium appointments you'd expect in a flagship vehicle. Nothing looks budget or out of place, demonstrating that Volvo is on par with any Euro competitor.

The R-Design's front sport seats are nubuck/leather, with full power adjust and optional cushion extenders for the long-legged. Other R-Design touches include aluminum/rubber pedals, illuminated treadplates, perforated leather steering wheel, and "silk metal" window trim. The latter is a treat for those tired of carbon fibre and its many faux flavours.

I'm also a fan of Volvo's Sensus infotainment system. The 9.3-inch touchscreen works like a tablet, and organizes functions sensibly. Driver aids, for example, are all grouped, unlike some vehicles where you go on a fishing trip to disable some of the more

Another thoughtful techy trick is the positioning of climate controls. They're at the bottom of every screen - no matter how deep you venture into menus and submenus.

Volvo may be repositioning the brand in the minds of buyers, but they've never strayed from a focus on safety. And V90 gets the full treatment. City Safety (the umbrella for Volvo's crash avoidance system) is standard, along with collision warning, pedestrian and cyclist detection - with full auto braking. There's also distance alert, lane departure warning and lane keeping aid, road edge detection with auto steer (to gently nudge you back), and more.

I realize the V90 may not be a volume seller, but at the same time it's worth considering a comeback of the wagon. Some of us may think we're safer in a vehicle on stilts, but the laws of physics and the wagon's lower centre of gravity prove otherwise.

Add in all-wheel-drive, spacious cargo carrying, and in the case of V90, a 3,500-pound towing capacity, and you have a stellar alternative to the sport utility.

2018 MAZDA CX-5 DIESEL

It is being described as a 'vehicle worth waiting for'

The 2018 Mazda CX-5 will now have the option of being equipped with a Diesel engine.




