## Amazon to build massive centre in Caledon

Amazon is coming to Caledon — in a big way.

Amazon announced Wednesday plans for a new fulfillment centre in the Town of Caledon. The 1-million square-foot facility will create more than 800 full-time jobs with comprehensive

benefits and join Amazon's network of existing Ontario buildings in Brampton, Mississauga, Milton and the recently announced facility in Ottawa. This will be Amazon's sixth fulfillment centre in Ontario, where it currently employs more than 2,000 full-time associates, and the ninth facility in Canada.

The Town says it will be built on Coleraine West.

"We continue to be excited about our growth in Ontario and the opportunity to better serve our customers in the region," said Glenn Sommerville, Director of Amazon Operations in Canada in a release. "We're seeing an incredible workforce and community support in Greater Toronto. It makes us proud to add a new

fulfillment centre to better meet customer demand while creating more than 800 full-time jobs with great pay and benefits to support the local economy."

Associates at this facility will pick, pack, and ship small items to customers such as books, electronics and toys. The Caledon fulfillment centre together with the new facility in Ottawa will bring more than 1,400 new jobs to Ontario by the end of 2019.

"Caledon is the ideal home for Amazon's latest Canadian expansion. I'm so pleased to welcome this world class, leading edge and customer focused organization to our community," said Caledon Mayor Allan Thompson. "The creation of good paying, stable, long term jobs will bolster our local economy and positively impact Caledon's future sustainability."

Full-time employees at Amazon receive competitive hourly wages, medical, vision and dental coverage, a group RRSP plan, stock awards, and performance-based bonuses starting

on day one. Amazon also offers employees access to innovative programs like Career Choice, where it will pre-pay up to 95 per cent of tuition for courses related to in-demand fields, regardless of whether the skills are relevant to a career at Amazon.

Since the program's launch, more than 16,000 employees across the globe have pursued degrees in game design and visual communications, nursing, IT programming and radiology, to name a few.

"It was great news to hear that Amazon is opening another fulfillment centre in Ontario. This is a wonderful opportunity for Bolton and Ontario," said Jim Wilson, Ontario Minister of Economic Development, Job Creation and Trade. # Couple helps Inuit youth develop sense of pride through hockey

A local resident has travelled a very long way to help improve the lives of indigenous youth. Breanna Capobianco is making a difference and she's showcasing her efforts at an upcoming fundraiser golf tournament at Nobleton Lakes.

Capobianco moved to a fly-in Arctic community called Salluit, Nunavik as a teacher. In 2015, she and partner Jeremy Marshall created the Salluit Amaruq Hockey Club.

"As teachers, we were alarmed by the high drop-out and youth suicide rate in the community," she said. "We decided to create a program that provides a platform for Inuit youth to develop cultural pride and develop the skills

necessary to become the future leaders, trainers, and coaches in their community. Using hockey as a tool, the SAHC promotes positive behaviour and high attendance at school, provides Inuit youth with opportunities to become engaged, positive leaders in their communities, and creates chances for a genuine exchange of cultures."

Their program is a volunteer-run non-profit and 100% of the profits go directly to the youth. Since the creation of the SAHC in 2015, they have witnessed first-hand the positive impact of the SAHC on the youth in our program.

"We hope to continue to improve and expand this 2018-19 year by further working to eliminate barriers that restrict youth from engaging in team sports such as registration fees, equipment costs, travel and shipping costs. We are also excited to announce that we have added an all-girls team to our program!"

While well received by the community, it was hard work establishing a hockey program. "They took us in with open arms and were very supportive of us as educators and coaches," said Marshall. "It was difficult at times to establish the hockey program but the students, parents, community members, Town Manager Adamie Papigatuk, and Mayor Paulusie Saviadjuk stood beside us and supported us through our fundraising, funding applications, and training. We have been lucky to get support from organizations such as Brighter Futures, Makivik, Landholding Corporation, and the Northern Village of Salluit. They are open to sharing their culture and wisdom with us as we develop as teachers and coaches."

Capobianco said as new teachers in the area, it was important to expand their experiences

and exposure beyond the small towns that both she and Marshall grew up in. Both her and Marshall wanted to learn more about the Arctic region and the culture.

The primary focus of the program is to promote school and community involvement, while providing an opportunity for youth to share their Inuit culture. All that kids need to do to be involved in our program is have good attendance, positive behaviour, and participate in team training as well as team hosted community events.

"Our goal is to make hockey accessible to all youth regardless of skill level or access to hockey equipment," Marshall said. "We aim to eliminate barriers restricting access to hockey which is why we attempt to provide equipment, do not charge registration fees, and are not exclusive based on skill level."

Capobianco added the program continues to grow and improve each year. Each year they attend a hockey tournament in "the South," where the team participates in tournaments and cultural exchanges. The youth make friends with other teams, learn about other cultures, and share their culture.

In addition to ongoing practices and annual tournaments, students who maintain 80% attendance are eligible to win a trip to a southern hockey camp during the summer. This year they added an all-girls team to our program and the girls are very excited about it.

Capobianco said teachers and parents have all noticed increased motivation and initiative both in school and at home.

"As a coach and manager, it has been rewarding to see these youth grow together as a team and develop strong, lasting friendships. These youth astound us every day with their strength, their humour, their resilience, and their talent. Our goal is to empower youth and provide them with the support and tools necessary to become the future coaches, trainers, and leaders in their communities," she said.

The community of Salluit is strong and the youth are resilient. At a time of tragedy the community comes together to support one another. There are some government supports and social services in place. Social services and the Department of Youth Protection work tirelessly alongside the community and the school to support youth. Unfortunately, there are not enough of them to reach everyone.

Marshall admitted that living in an isolated community is not without its challenges, but the youth and the overwhelmingly supportive community provide them with the passion and drive to move forward.

"Watching the students improve on and off the ice and seeing the students come together for training and community events is so rewarding. Witnessing the excitement and pride the players and parents have in their culture as they share it with us, our families, and others is incredible. We believe it's important to provide these youth with opportunities to share their amazing culture with the rest of Canada," he said.

Travelling and shipping costs alone are very expensive in the North. A round-trip flight to Salluit can cost upwards of \$3,000 per person. Since they do not charge registration fees, they rely solely on fundraising and donation to allow the program to continue to function.

The main fundraiser each year is the annual fundraising golf tournament. This year the tournament is at the Nobleton Lakes Golf Club on Saturday, July 28. Registration begins at 12 p.m. and there is a shotgun start at 1 p.m. Registration fees include golf, power cart, dinner, prizes and an amazing silent auction! 

# Bolton man dies after arrest in Queen Street parking lot

A 43-year-old Bolton man is dead and now the province's Special Investigations Unit (SIU) has been called in to find out why. Reports from the SIU and the Caledon detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police state the unidentified man died Monday (July 23) after being taken to hospital by local paramedics.

Police received multiple 911 calls at about 1:45 p.m. concerning a man in a vehicle in a parking lot adjacent to Landsbridge Street and Allan Drive. Caledon OPP officers were dispatched and they located the man and arrested him for impaired operation of a motor vehicle by drug. At some point, officers became concerned for the man's health and called EMS, who transported him to hospital where he went

into medical distress and was pronounced dead at 4:29 p.m. The OPP has notified the province's Special Investigations Unit (SIU) and they have invoked their mandate. As a result, the OPP will not be able to provide any further information.

**Double the speed limit**  
On Monday, July 16 at about 12:20 a.m., an officer from the Community Response Unit at the Caledon OPP Detachment was travelling westbound on Mayfield Road near The Gore Road when he observed a black 2018 Toyota Camry travelling at a high rate of speed above the posted speed limit. The officer activated the radar unit and determined the speed of the vehicle to be 117 km/hr in a posted 60 km/hr zone. As a result, a 25-year-old California man has been charged with Race a Motor Vehicle - Excessive Speed. The driver received a seven-day licence suspension and his motor vehicle was seized for a period of seven days as a result of the stunt driving charge. The defendant is to appear at the Ontario Court of Justice in Caledon East on September 10 to answer to the charge.

**Lost equipment**  
On Wednesday, July 18, Caledon OPP was conducting a Reduce Impaired Driving Everywhere (RIDE) program on Highway 410 northbound off-ramp to Valleywood Boulevard. During this time, an officer placed an Approved Screening Device (ASD), a Drager Alcotest 6810, in a bright orange pelican case on the cruiser. In an effort to locate a motorist that had run from his personal vehicle in order to evade the RIDE spot check, the officer inadvertently left the equipment on the cruiser and drove away. Officers later returned to the location to retrieve the ASD, but were unable to find it. Police are asking anyone with information about the loss contents to contact PC Tamara Schubert of the Caledon OPP at 905-584-2241 ext. 4054.

**Teens arrested**  
On Tuesday, July 17at about 12:04 a.m., members from the Caledon Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police responded to a report of suspicious activity in the SouthFields Village subdivision. The complainant, a member of the SFV & Anthem Neighbourhood Watch group, informed police that two males were observed going through unlocked vehicles and stealing items from inside. Thanks to the information received, police were able to successfully locate the teens on Dougall Avenue near Valley Lane and investigated the matter. As a result, two young persons, who cannot be identified as per the Youth Criminal Justice Act have been arrested and charged criminally with multiple offences. A 15-year-old boy from Caledon was charged with the following offences: Fail to Comply with Undertaking, Theft Under \$5,000 from a Motor Vehicle, Possession of Property Obtained by Crime Under \$5,000, and Possession of a Schedule II Substance- Cannabis Marihuana - under 30 grams. In addition, a 17-year-old boy from Brampton was charged with the following offences: Fail to Comply with Undertaking, Possession of Property Obtained by Crime Under \$5,000, and Theft Under \$5,000 from a Motor Vehicle. **Child seat not secured**  
On Friday, July 20, 2018 at approximately 11:48 am, an officer from the Traffic Unit of the Caledon OPP was conducting enforcement in the area of Mayfield Road and Kennedy Road when he observed the driver of a motor vehicle committing a seat belt infraction and conducted a traffic stop. While speaking to the driver, the officer observed a car seat in the rear of the vehicle wedged between the seats, insecure, with a toddler seated inside. Headaches, slippery roads, lousy hair days...little obstacles that can lead to cancelled plans.

For Mirella, nothing can stop her from attending LINC (Language Instruction for Newcomers to Canada) classes in Caledon.

Mirella is nine months pregnant and recovering from the flu, but she is still energetic and active within the classroom.

"I do feel very sick and tired, but I refuse to stop coming here. Maybe I'll give birth here in this classroom," she laughs.

Before coming to Canada, Mirella had a busy life back home in her native Beirut, Lebanon. Her calendar was packed with days spent teaching French and evenings busy with friends.

After getting married, she moved to Canada and settled down in Caledon Village. As you'd expect, the move took some time to adjust to, as it was a significant change to her lifestyle back home. Majority of her days were spent on her own, and her calendar was uncharacteristically empty. While

Mirella's husband was at work, she didn't have the confidence to go out alone and attempt communicating with strangers. However, things began to change once Mirella started attending LINC classes.

"My confidence in public was at a zero, but after my second week here I started talking in public and going out. It's like magic! I don't know how I got this confidence," Mirella beams.

With 11 years of teaching English as a second language under her belt, instructor Suma Balagopal says her classroom is very unique because the setting is often described as an "extended family" by most students. "I think we are able to create an environment where they feel safe to make mistakes, and then gifted the wings to take flight and pursue their plans in Canada as they make this land their home."

After giving birth, Mirella wants to come back to complete one more semester at LINC. Mirella eventually wants to become a French teacher here in Canada. With her new found confidence, she is well on her way to making her dreams come true!

## Artist believes creating to be a beautiful experience

“It’s all about bringing people into a place which feeds their passion. Then, they share that passion with those other people and the issues around their disabilities are no longer at the forefront.”

From August 8 to 12, the proof of how well this works is on exhibition in the Falls Gallery at the Alton Mill Arts Centre in Alton. Sadie’s [Sarah Godfrey] Showcase is five days of demonstrating that what matters to her and her guest artist, Nathan Gatten, that they are artists of considerable talent and interest. Further than that, they use their unique insights to enhance and create art as others do not and reaches for the stars in a way, mysteriously, few other artists do.

Sadie, Sarah’s nickname, has been mentored by some well-known artists, including Pete Paterson, Jane Ohland Cameron, Susan and

Tony Reynolds and, most recently, Paul Morin. All these artists and more have brought Sadie along, encouraged her in her art and her confidence.

Sadie loves being creative. “I love that people want to see my art . . . I’m very shy so I am happier showing how I feel with my art.”

Indeed, she is happiest, perhaps, when people are wearing her art, for she now has a business called Kalleidescope Designs whereby she invites a customer to choose from 24 of her original designs and receive on order, prints, cards and/or shirts, called “Sadie Shirts”. She was helped to establish this business by Facilitation Wellington-Dufferin: Lead Facilitator, Jodee Jack.

In her first year with the shirts, Sadie was part of the Creative Partners On Stage (C.P.O.S.) production of Out of the Box at Theatre Orangeville. Every member of the cast was wearing one of her Sadie Shirts.

It was during this extraordinary production, written and directed by Jane Ohland Cameron, that Sadie spoke her monologue, which she wrote herself and through which she declared herself as an artist, speaking, as her mother, Leslie, remarked, “very movingly about seeing the world through her art. The response was overwhelming and gratifying. In a sense, she emerged through that experience with the support and enthusiasm of other creative people.”

Her beginnings with painting and art took place at the Learning Centre in Toronto, at a therapy program in the early 1990s, Sadie told the Citizen. At that time, she was part of a documentary on the Discovery Channel called The Child That You Do Have.

She said, in addition, “I had a really good art teacher at ODSS, ...Jan Pinney who made funky jewellery and used awesome colours and designs. I love her work.”

Also, she commented, “My stepdad, Glenn, is an artist and former art teacher...so, I’ve been around art all my life.”

Paul Morin offered to mentor Sadie prior to the show for the sake of furthering her work and to give her a chance to paint with him. It was very thrilling for her.

There was a firm “yes” in answer to the question if Mr. Morin helped her improve her work. Said she, “The painting sessions with him really worked. Ideas flowed from being there.”

Leslie added, “One of the gifts that Paul has, he creates a space so full of energy and light.”

The decision to invite Nathan Gatten was fairly simple. They were connected by that same Jodee Jack, and, so Leslie commented, “We met Nathan with the idea that it would be up to Sadie if she wanted him. From the beginning, I would say both families hit it off well.”

“I’ve seen his dog paintings and I love them,” Sadie told us. “He’s a really nice guy.”

In a similar conversation with Nathan and his father, Jon, we learned that Nathan has been painting since 2010 under the mentorship of Meredith Blackmore. Before that, he

drew everywhere and all the time since he was about nine years old.

However, as he says in his artist’s statement, “My love of drawing had shed its skin and gave way for my desire for colour and texture.”

Meredith Blackmore is an artist in oil painting, a portrait artist.

“I don’t do portraits,” Nathan averred but “she really pushed in a good way. Meredith helped me and I took off from there.” Of his many paintings, his favourite seems to be painting stars as the Hubble telescope shows them in all their splendour and mystery.

“I love reading astronomy magazines and National Geographic.”

Talking about his space paintings, which are of the Hubble sightings, “These are surprisingly beautiful. Painting is almost a meditative experience. No one’s really painting these.

“I did a series of wolf paintings.” He was asked for a wolf painting and then another, as well as pet dog portraits.

For the show, he is bringing some of his dog paintings and those of space, some landscapes.

“They are based on a Cherokee legend that we have two wolves within us, one represents good and the other bad; the winner is the one that you feed.” he told the Citizen. “I studied philosophy around the time I started painting. I started asking those sorts of questions, finding ways of relaxing. I love to read – books about Gandhi and Buddha – biographies. I am an information sponge. Learning never ends.”

Reflectively, he said, “It’s really helpful – I have some medical problems, so, it’s hard to travel. I’m painting the ultimate travel.”

About art: “I encourage(it). Everyone should have the chance to have a creative outlet. It’s really making time for yourself; it allows you to look at and be personal with yourself. It’s a beautiful experience.”

Sadie’s Showcase featuring both Sadie and Nathan is on in the Falls Gallery at the Alton Mill Arts Centre from Wednesday, Aug. 8 - 12, with an opening reception on Thursday, Aug. 9 from 5:30 to 8 p.m.

# Parking Regulations

When it comes to parking in residential driveways, the primary purpose of Town By-laws is to keep neighbourhoods safe.

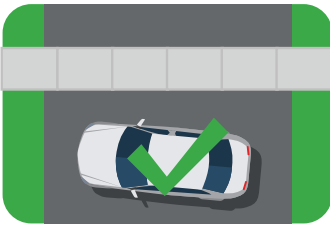
#### SIDEWALKS

Vehicles parked in driveways shall not block a sidewalk. This is to ensure that vehicles don't pose a danger to those using the sidewalk by getting in the way of strollers, wheelchairs and pedestrians.



#### CURBS

Parked vehicles shall not overhang the curb, grassed areas or obstruct the boulevard in any way. Doing this can cause a dangerous problem for traffic. If necessary, the vehicle may be parked parallel to the curb on the part of the driveway between the sidewalk and the road. Be sure that your vehicle does not block the road or the sidewalk and is not on the grass or landscaped area.



#### LAWNS

Parking on the front lawn or any grassed area of a property is not permitted. Vehicles parked on the front lawn can damage the lawn, detract from the streetscape and allow automotive fluids (i.e. gas, oil) to leak into the soil and groundwater.

## Dolce offer diners the authentic Italian experience

For exactly one year, Suthan Rasa’s restaurant Dolce has been a neighbourhood hub, the kind of place where everybody knows your name. Located in Caledon Village at the corner of Hurontario Street and Highway 24, this beloved community restaurant is a place to come, relax, and experience some delicious authentic Italian cuisine.

Chef Suthan Rasa originally chose the location for Dolce because he was drawn to the peaceful community feel of the town. Originally from Sri Lanka, which he left to escape the bloody civil war, he arrived in Canada and immediately found work in some of the prominent Italian restaurants of Toronto. He began by making the pastas, then was promoted to salads, and eventually became a sous chef, all the while learning from other master chefs about the art of fine Italian dining.

Dolce is the culmination of those years of hard work and experience, the perfect traditional Italian restaurant down to the red and white checked table cloths. Its bustling atmosphere on the weekends does not detract from the cozy feel of the place, as the restaurant is often packed at both lunch and dinner. The restaurant

can accommodate 25-30 people, and is often booked for events such as birthdays, anniversaries and parties.

Dolce specializes in its 45 variations of pizzas and pastas, and even offers alternatives for the health conscious, such as gluten free, whole wheat, rice or spelt pasta, available upon request. Their menu also features a meat section with traditional and non-traditional items such as fish and chips, chicken souvlaki, and rainbow trout.

Each day features a daily pasta special, and each week Chef Rasa sets a special prix fix menu of three courses.

A small bar offers basic wine, beer and spirits, as well as mixed drinks. To top off the experience, traditional Italian deserts are on offer, in addition to a variety of cheesecakes.

Aside from eating in-house, Dolce offers a great take-out menu featuring everything from large family and party trays to individualized pizza orders, soups, antipasti, sandwiches, meats, pastas and fish.

In short, Dolce offers everything a good Italian could want, and then some.

When asked, Chef Rasa points out the gnocchi gorgonzola as his favourite dish, and this reporter has to agree. After also sampling the spaghetti (better than any I

have ever tasted), fried calamari, and the pancetta e fungi pizza, each dish proved more delicious than the last. The most frequently ordered dishes at Dolce are the chicken parmesan, rainbow trout, spaghetti a la dolce, and the gnocchi a la vege.

To celebrate Dolce’s anniversary in August, Chef Rasa is offering a month-long set menu for \$35. Walk-ins are always welcome, but since weekends are

so busy, making a reservation is a sure bet for a table at this to-die-for establishment. Hours of operation are Tuesdays-Fridays 11a.m. - 9 p.m., Saturdays 2-9 p.m., and Sundays 11 a.m.- 8 p.m.

In many ways, Dolce represents the Canadian dream; an immigrant from a war-torn country becomes a successful entrepreneur, the master of another nationality’s cuisine to be enjoyed by Canadians of all ethnicities.

# Easiest way to save a life

There are some things about our species that really make me scratch my head. For example, motorists who refuse to give up the passing lane on the highway. They're like NRA members. "I'll give you this passing lane when you take it from my cold, dead hands."

One would imagine they know better, but refuse to move all the same despite the frequent wild hand gestures and flashing of bright lights from those behind them. I think studies should be done to find out why they have this unnatural need to remain in the passing lane while driving dead on the speed limit.

Another trait many people share is the refusal to give blood, especially when it's needed the most (which is right now, in case you're wondering). I understand that a few people have a genuine fear of needles and others feel they can't spare the half hour or so, but those don't hold water for me.

People survive because other people give blood. Doctors were able to treat the survivors of the Humboldt Broncos bus tragedy because strangers gave blood.

For those of you who don't know how it works allow me to walk you through the process.

Some people walk in, but the best way to go about it is to register on the Canadian Blood Services website at [blood.ca](http://blood.ca). It just takes a minute. Then you make an appointment at the location closest to you. In this case, that would be the Caledon Community Complex at 6215 Old Church Road on Aug. 2 from 3 – 7 p.m.

Now there are a few health-related questions you're going to have to answer, most of which can be answered online. At least one of them has to do with handling monkeys, so if you're an organ grinder or an extra from the Planet of the Apes movie, you have an excuse.

When you arrive, check in at the front desk. If you're experience is anything like mine, you'll be treated like royalty just for being there.

This brings me to a brief break in the process to inform you that while nothing should take the place of regular medical check-ups with your doctor, giving blood is actually a pretty good way to keep on top of things. I've given blood dozens of times, but on one occasion it was discovered that my red blood cell count was low. I was advised to see my physician, who put me through a battery of tests I wouldn't have otherwise requested, including a colonoscopy that led to biopsies being done on a number of polyps. I once walked my dog through a forest with many rises and drops in terrain and felt like I was an old man by the end of it, but they did warn me not to do anything like that in the first place so it's on me.

One other point that needs to be made: If you have O-negative blood, everything doubles in importance because everyone, regardless of blood type, can accept O-negative. You have blood that really wants to be heroic, so allow it to do its job.

There are people everywhere, every day, whose life or death depends on getting blood from a stranger. Feel good about yourself and help them out, won't you?

# Bank of Canada interest rate hike hits consumers again

The Bank of Canada recently raised the overnight lending rate to 1.5 per cent from 1.25 per cent. This was the fourth increase in just over a year, which means Canadian consumers will likely end up paying more for such things as variable-rate mortgages and lines of credit. It also means that Canadians are going to be paying more for the money the current Liberal government has borrowed. It is, therefore, not the time for more Liberal tax hikes to further burden Canadian taxpayers who are already stretched to the limit.

The Bank of Canada points out that there are big risks for the Canadian economy – trade uncertainty and tariffs, rising interest rates, higher consumer debt, vulnerability in housing, and higher inflation. This is the wrong time for Prime Minister Justin Trudeau and the current Liberal government to be imposing new taxes on Canadians. These are threats that the Bank of Canada has been warning about for years. A responsible government would’ve prepared for a downturn by setting aside funds or paying down debt. Instead, the Prime Minister has added \$60 billion to the national debt in his first three years in power. Last year, Canada’s net debt reached an all-

time high of \$670 billion or \$47,612 per Canadian family.

Consumer debt is also a serious concern in Canada. In 2017, Canadian households had a record \$1.74 of debt for every dollar of disposable income. As interest rates rise over the next three years, debt payments will consume a larger share of household income than at any time in the last three decades. As households are “shocked” with higher interest on their credit cards and mortgages, their taxes will need to rise to pay a one-third or \$8 billion increase in federal government debt interest. The gravity of this situation cannot be understated – Canada’s combined personal, business, and government debt is now three times the size of the entire Canadian economy.

All of this is sobering news for Canadians. Prime Minister Trudeau spent the cupboard bare when rates were low and times were good. Now consumers and households will be forced to pay for his reckless borrowing. In 2009, the previous Conservative government was able to take decisive action to support the Canadian economy. The cupboard will be bare the next time Canada is faced with a crisis.

Canadians remember that Prime Minister Trudeau broke his promise to only run small deficits of \$10 billion per year and to balance the budget by 2019. He now admits the budget won’t be balanced until 2045 – twenty-five years later than he promised. As a result of his reckless borrowing, Canadians will spend \$40 billion annually

on federal debt interest by 2021 – a 60 per cent increase from last year. This means higher taxes for Canadians to pay wealthy bond holders and bankers. Furthermore, the cost of living is rising and Prime Minister Trudeau is making it worse. His carbon tax will raise the price of everything and his reckless borrowing means higher interest on debt for consumers and taxpayers. He should’ve considered how future interest rate hikes would impact Canadian families before he raised taxes on gasoline and home heating; Canadians’ savings accounts; and payroll taxes for businesses.

## Artist finds spirituality

The work of a King artist pays homage to creativity and spirituality. In fact, this one piece of glass work will be on display as a complement to Austrian history.

World-renowned artist Ernestine Tahedl created a 2.5-metre metal and glass church window, capturing both classical and modern abstract designs. It was a modern resurrection of a piece uncovered in the 16th century tower of the Stift St. Florian monastery near Linz, Austria. Tahedl has been a special guest in the past and she was chosen to create something special for the church. During renovations several years ago, workers uncovered an original window inside a wall that hasn’t seen the light of day in hundreds of years. It had to remain in place, but they wanted to bring the architecture back to life in some way.

That’s where Tahedl came in. She began her career in stained glass and she submitted concept drawings, along with other contemporary Austrian artists, for a chance to recreate history.

Her designs were ultimately chosen and she spent a couple of weeks in a workshop in Vienna painting the panels and assembling the window. She decided to paint on the reverse side of the glass, which presented some unique challenges, even for such a seasoned artist.

She painted the panels on the floor, keeping in mind what the images would look like when viewed from the other side. She noted she had to approach it in the exact opposite way of a typical painting. It was challenging, but she admitted the process kept her “fresh.”

The piece is reflective of Tahedl’s unique style and colour schemes. She used stronger, more vibrant colours to make the piece “pop.”

While she had a concept plan in mind, the piece took on a life of its own during the process. Not only does it look great, but it belongs in the basilica.

It was simply amazing to be part of this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity. To find a piece of 600-year-old history, recreate it and have it installed, is “inspiring.”

“I’m just thrilled,” she said.

The abstract design is based on Anton Bruckner’s music. The composer, loved for his creativity

and humility, played the organ at the church and is, in fact, buried in a crypt immediately below his favorite organ.

The facility is the home of St. Florian’s Priory, a community of Canons Regular named after Saint Florian and one of the oldest operational monasteries in the world following the Rule of St. Augustine. Composer Bruckner (1824-96) was a choirboy and later organist in the town.

The foundation of the old Gothic church dates back to Roman times, but the modern reconstruction of the basilical began in 1686. The monastery was first documented in 819. Since 1071 Canons Regular of Saint Augustine’s order have been living there. Over the centuries the monastic building has adapted to the many changes in style. In parallel, the borough of St. Florian has become a well-known place in Europe. The church and grounds are considered to be among the most beautiful in all of Europe.

Tahedl paints while listening to the greats – Mozart, Schubert, Strauss and of course Bruckner, who’s considered to have written the most complex symphonies ever created.

The priory, and Catholic church, are reaching out to the public, and the younger generation to keep the faith alive. Through art and music, they hope others will embrace the tradition.

Tahedl said creativity and spirituality complement one another. In fact, music itself can be abstract in nature.

St. Florian preserves the very best of Austrian culture. Music, art and religion come together in regular music festivals. They have their own boys’ choir, similar to the world-famous Vienna Boys Choir.

The facility is home to one of the best collections of medieval art, with glass, paintings and sculptures spanning the 13th to 16th centuries. Monks have also painstakingly assembled one of the oldest libraries in Europe.

The richness of this institution, Tahedl said, is simply breathtaking. The dedication of the monks to preserve art, history, music and literature is admirable.

That richness has become even greater, thanks to Tahedl’s unique contribution.

## 7th annual Free Dental Day a resounding success

It has been another successful year for local dentist Dr. Raj Khanuja, who just last month celebrated the success of the seventh-annual iteration of his ongoing 'Doing Positive in my Backyard' campaign.

Launched back in 2012, Dr. Khanuja and his staff at Headwaters Dental Centre, located at 170 Lakeview Court in Orangeville, have dedicated one day each year to providing free dental care to the community's most vulnerable residents. On June 13, the team did it all again as they welcomed a record 34 patients through the doors of the local facility.

"It has been a special year for us with free dental day," Dr. Khanuja told the Citizen. "We saw a lot of people coming to us for help, and we helped more people than ever this time. There is a real need for this type of service here in Orangeville. We're happy we're able to do our part."

Dr. Khanuja has been lauded on both the provincial and national stage for his work with the program, receiving numerous awards for his efforts. Most recent was the prestigious June Callwood Outstanding Achievement Award for Voluntarism, dished out to Dr. Khanuja back in April. He is one of the 12 individuals and four organizations to receive this award from the Ontario government. Headwaters Dental has also been recognized with a Canadian Business Excellence Award for a Private Business in each of the past two years.

Dental Care Day as it has been coined by Dr. Khanuja is catching on. Already this year, Dr. Khanuja

has led similar initiatives at his other dental centres in Brampton, Stoney Creek and Fergus. While he envisages the program spreading even further over the coming years, it's in Orangeville where it all began.

While he is proud of what he has been able to do through Free Dental Day and his greater 'Doing Positive in my Backyard' initiative, he takes satisfaction in the smiles and appreciation of those patients who, without the generosity of those at Headwaters Dental, would likely forego their dental health.

"These people are always very happy, very glad, very thankful. They can't believe that they're able to get this work done for free," Dr. Khanuja said. "For a lot of these people, they have been in pain or discomfort for a long time. To have even a small issue fixed is a big deal for them. We can see it right away, the relief. We're delighted to be able to give back to our community and help people who really need it."

Inspiration for the program was born when Dr. Khanuja participated in an overseas mission trip to help provide oral healthcare services to citizens of developing nations several years ago. That inspiration blossomed when Dr. Raj met a local mother who, he says, was ignoring her dental issues so that she could provide for her young children.

"I guess the thing that actually kicked it all off was when I continued seeing a mother with three children coming into our office, bringing her kids in for work on their teeth," Dr. Khanuja said. "She was always focused on her children, never making appointments for herself, even though I knew she had an issue with a tooth. I told her it was only going to get worse unless

she got it fixed."

He added, "This mother told me that she had a decision between fixing her tooth or purchasing hockey gear for her son, and she picked the hockey gear. That really touched my heart. I saw this was a mother who was doing her best as a single parent to take care of her kids, providing for them what they needed while sacrificing her health because she couldn't afford to take care of both things."

"That's when I knew I had to start this program, and I knew she was going to be its first patient," Dr. Khanuja finished.

The centre offers three procedures on Free Dental Day – a full dental cleaning, a tooth coloured filling, limited to one tooth per patient, or a simple tooth extraction, again limited to one tooth per patient. Although Dr. Raj and his team at Headwaters Dental have carried out close to 200 procedures since the inception of Free Dental Day, he'd still like to do more.


Describing his "dream" to the Citizen, Dr. Raj said he'd like to introduce a permanent community clinic to the Headwaters region, where people who can't otherwise afford dental work can go in case of emergency.

"My vision has always been this, to provide a centre, a space where residents go to get the help they need and, frankly, deserve," Dr. Khanuja said. "We're not there yet, but I hope that one day we can see something like this become a reality for this region."

# Optimism important for seniors

the sunny side of life:

1. Take ownership and recognize that your health is your own. To achieve your best health, you need to set personal goals - just for you.

2. Engage with your doctor or other health care professional and build a trusting relationship.

3. Find a higher purpose that makes you excited to get up in the morning. Humana's survey found that the majority of respondents (86 percent) who identify as optimists also rank a sense

of purpose as an important attribute for aging.

4. Remain socially engaged, not isolated, and nurture close relationships. The importance of social engagement is recognized by the 71 percent of Humanas survey respondents who identify as optimists and get to

gether with friends or relatives either monthly or weekly. Further, 80 percent of optimists say maintaining an active social life is an important motivator to stay healthy.

5. Stay active and remember that physical activity is important. Find something that's right for you and that you like to do. Almost all of the most optimistic survey respondents (97 per cent) say remaining physically active is a major motivator for retaining good health.

6. Practice gratitude and make it a habit to look for and appreciate everything you're thankful for in life.

“As a boomer myself, I know that the majority of the decisions about my own health take place outside of a doctor’s office,” said Dr. Hernandez Suarez. “With the knowledge that optimism may be linked to health and well-being, I’m focused on making positive health decisions through all aspects of my life. Our goal at Humana is to empower everyone to approach health in the same way.”

Respite is a service offered by Caledon Community Services (CCS), but it would be better described as a lifeline for seniors who just need a little help going from here to there, doing chores, or even craving a little company.

The official description of respite on the CCS website says, “Respite workers provide non-medical care and companionship for seniors and adults with disabilities within their homes. Respite workers supervise and support individuals so their regular caregivers can have some time away from care giving responsibilities.”

Of course, that's an apt description, but there's much more to it than that.

"Our program has been around since around 1994 and it operates in a brokerage model," said Kim Shadlock, senior manager, health services for CCS said. "In this model we act as a link between the individual seeking respite companionship services and the those willing to provide those services. Once we link them then they build a relationship together."

That relationship is crucial because a respite worker — which is not the same as a personal care worker — needs to be in tune with their client and the client needs to be able to trust them and enjoy their company.

“Respite is an opportunity to provide some relief to a caregiver, to provide companion-

ship. It might be some light housekeeping. One recent experience I've had with a client is they loved to cook, so they had a respite worker come in and support the process. They had some health issues and they needed the support."

Respite workers also drive seniors to appointments or spend time with the client so the caregiver can make it to an appointment of their own.

“Companionship is a big element of it, but if there are other things they may want the respite worker to participate with the client in, it’s negotiated between the respite worker and the client and the caregiver of that client,” Shadlock said.

The process begins when Shadlock first connects with the client for an assessment.

"It's really basic information to understand their circumstances, their mobility, any language issues, any cognitive issues, that kind of thing."

Once that assessment has been done, Shadlock provides the names of three workers. Then it's up to the patient to contact one or all of them. The client can select all of them, if they want, with each coming over on a separate day.

The important thing is the client and primary caregiver feel comfortable with the worker. Once that's achieved, the relationship builds into a friendship that benefits everyone.

# Scammers set targets on seniors with multiple plays

According to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre, four scams currently target senior Canadians. Each scam is outlined below.

**Prize Scams**

Seniors are solicited over the phone, email, through the mail or via social media websites claiming that they are the winner of a large lottery or sweepstake. Scammers advise that you have won a prize and in order to receive the winnings you are required to pay a small advance fee to cover taxes or legal fees associated to the win. After the fee is paid, no prize is ever received.

**Emergency scams**

Scammers use social media, the internet and phones to target potential senior victims

with the emergency scam. Seniors receive a call claiming to be a family member or a close friend describing an urgent situation that requires immediate funds. Common themes have been that the family member (e.g. grandchild) was arrested or got into an accident while travelling abroad. Monies are required for hospital expenses, lawyer fees or bail. Usually the potential victim is instructed to send money via a money service business like Western Union or MoneyGram or through prepaid cards, like Green Dot Money Pack, Pay Safe, or other types of gift cards.

**Service scams**

There are a variety of service scams targeting seniors but the most common involves consumers being tricked into having their

computer cleaned or repaired. Scammers call and claim to be a representative from a well-known computer company such as Microsoft or Windows. The scammers will claim that the victim's computer is sending out viruses or has been hacked and must be serviced. The scammer will remotely access the victim's computer and may run programs or alter settings. The scammer will advise that a fee is required for this service and request payment by credit card or money service business. In certain cases, the scammer will transfer funds from the victim's computer through a money service business such as Western Union or MoneyGram.

**Romance scams**

Scammers steal photos and use dating sites

and social media to lure potential victims into sending money for various reasons. The scammer will gain the trust of the victim through displays of affection and will communicate via phone, skype and email for months, if needed to build trust. The scammer will often claim to be working abroad, usually in a lucrative business venture.

Eventually the scammer will want to meet with the victim in person. It is at this time that the scammer will inform them that they cannot afford to travel and will ask for money to cover travel costs. Another variation involves the scammer claiming that there is a medical emergency with a sick family member. They will then ask for money to cover medical expenses.

# Ironman Knuckey running for the record in Hawaii

The Hollywood Ironman is just an actor in a costume, but if you want the real deal, check out Alton's Bob Knuckey. The 70-year-old Knuckey just might be one of the greatest athletes on the planet, factoring age in the equation.

Four years ago, he captured the triathlon world championship in the male 65-69 age group at the 2014 Subaru Ironman 70.3 World Championship triathlon in Mont-Tremblant, Quebec. Knuckey completed the 70.3-mile endurance event — encompassing a 1.2-mile swim, followed by a 56-mile bicycle ride and finally a 13.1-mile run in 5:10:34, beating out the top athletes in his age group in an event that featured competitors from 49 U.S. states and 87 countries around the world.

Since then he has been at or near the top in several endurance races, including six Ironman competitions that consist of a 26.2-mile run, after a swim of 2.4 miles and bike trek for 112. This October, if all goes well between now and then, he plans to race the Ironman in Kona, Hawaii, which could be considered the granddaddy of them all. First run in 1978 with 15 competitors, the event now features more than 2,000 athletes from around the world.

"I started off in high school cross-country running. After high school, I got into marathon running — I've done about 40 marathons — and in (1972) I won the Toronto Police Games Marathon

outright. I didn't know I was winning until about a kilometre to the end," he said with a laugh.

Knuckey laughed again when he was asked if his parents had been athletes themselves. "They were not athletic. I grew up in the back seat of a 1955 Ford with a cigar on one side and a cigarette on the other side and the windows closed. I've wondered how good I could have been without all that second-hand smoke inside of me."

A shy young man, running gave Knuckey confidence because he was good at it, so he simply continued to run throughout his life.

In the 1990s, Knuckey isn't sure when exactly, he was spotted by Barrie Shepley, the head coach of Olympic gold medalist Simon Whitfield, who won the inaugural event at the 2000 Olympics in Vancouver. Shepley is also the head coach at Caledon's Canadian Cross Training Club, better known as C3.

By then, Knuckey had spread his wings from just running to duathlons, which add cycling to the race.

"The next thing you knew, I was with C3."

Under Shepley's guidance, Knuckey has been improving every year. He swims every day, runs, cycles and keeps to a somewhat strict nutritional plan, even if he admits that he's not the most nutritional guy around.

"My goal is to go to Hawaii," he said. "This will be my third time there. The first time I walked the whole marathon. It was a learning experience. I didn't have a good nutrition plan. The second I did it

I went with my training partner. She's a 61-year-old lady from Mississauga who is an amazing runner. We both finished fifth that year. I ran the whole marathon, but it wasn't pretty."

This time, he wants to perform to his best and be done with the Ironman "because they're really hard on you. I find the run really hard, but I've got my nutrition plan and it's getting better all the time."

"My goal there is to break the record (for his age group). Two years ago, it was 12 hours, 59 minutes. Last year it was broken by half an hour, so it's now 12:29 and the race I ran to qualify for the Ironman, which was in Texas, I went 11:20."

With difficult wind and heat conditions in Hawaii, he hopes to run 11:50 and break the record, but he's under no illusions that it will be anything but easy.

For his part, Shepley said he has no doubt about the kind of man he's training.

"To watch one of the greatest endurance athletes every day for the last decade has been inspiring. At an age where many are slowing down and making excuses, Bob is doing weights, taking yoga classes and swim-bike-running spectacular distances. Imagine swimming from Caledon village to Inglewood. Then biking Inglewood to Hamilton and back to Inglewood. Then running from Inglewood to Nobelton all in one day without stopping? That is an Ironman. Bob's qualifying time of 11 hours, 20 minutes at Ironman Texas in April is one of the greatest Masters performances ever."

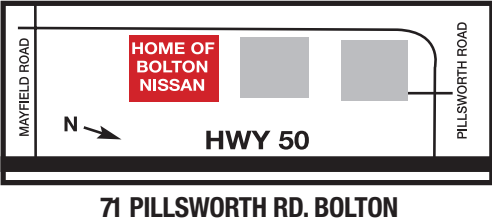

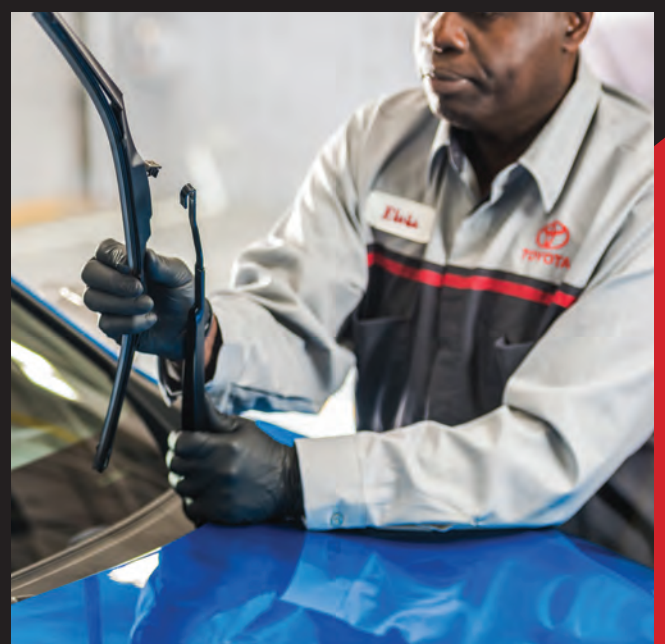
