Bowling. The rented shoes, gutter balls, strikes and spares. Almost everyone has been bowling at some time in their lives, but have you ever

been carpet bowling?

Played indoors on a 30ft carpet, the object of the game is to roll your ball as close as possible to the target white ball, called the jack. The closest ball is the winner. Carpet bowling is a fun, lowimpact game for all ages, including active seniors right here in Caledon.

Every Wednesday morning at the Riverview Terrace Senior Apartments, residents come together in the recreation room, ready to bowl and have fun.

Whether you're an expert bowler or watching from the sidelines, all are welcome here. The best part is that the entire activity is organized and run by senior volunteers!

It all started on a whim explains Wilma Moore, one of the senior volunteers who helps lead this activity.

"We had this carpet for about 25 years and it was just sitting in the closet," said Moore. "Everyone would ask about it, and I'd tell them it's used for carpet bowling and then all of a sudden it clued in, why don't we use it?"

That's when Wilma along with two other residents, Emily O'Neil and Mary Copeland, began carpet bowling within their residence, as part of Caledon Community Services' Seniors Helping Seniors program. The program encourages seniors to run their own senior activities within the community and provides financial support to purchase any supplies they might need.

Staying physically and mentally active is vital for seniors' health and wellness. Bernard Nadeau is a retired police officer who served 41 years with the Toronto police and he credits carpet bowling for helping him remain active.

"It gets you out of your apartments and you get to mingle with your friends," said Nadeau.

Seeing the residents enjoy themselves also makes it worthwhile for the senior volunteers.


"We see what it's doing for the residents and they talk about how much fun they had afterwards," said Moore. "We feel we started something that's rewarding and people are enjoying it."

### **Spotlight**

Members of police services throughout Ontario were able to ensure the safety of seven people who were in exploitative situations, including two under the age of 18 in this year's operation northern spotlight: as a result of Operation Northern Spotlight, a coordinated, national effort to end human trafficking.

Over a seven-day period, 45 police services across Ontario participated in the operation. Forty-five charges were laid against 15 people. A total of 317 police officers, support staff and victim services professionals engaged with 218 potential victims, as part vice of a joint effort coordinated by the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP). This was part of a national operation in partnership with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP). Collaboration among police services is extremely important due to the multi-jurisdictional nature of human trafficking.

Of the seven victims identified:

- Two were recovered by Peel Re-
- gional Police Service One was recovered by Waterloo Re-
- gional Police Service Three were recovered by Ottawa
- Police Service
- One was recovered by Niagara Regional Police Service

During Operation Northern Spotlight, police meet with individuals suspected of being in exploitative situations. They are provided contacts and information for community-based support agencies and are offered both immediate and future police assistance to leave the exploitation. ### Peel County celebrates its 200th anniversary

Written By Constance Scrafield

The recent celebrations of Canada's 150th anniversary may have clouded the fact of a history that goes back much further than that. The considerably earlier settlers, came, not from Europe but from, basically, Asia as long ago as 12,000 years. There are large numbers of relics and bones to verify this, discovered over many digs by archeologists, especially across the northern regions of this land.

Certainly, their familiar history, the extension of which is well recorded by European adventurers following the initial discovery of these lands from the east, is still substantially longer than 150 years.

Although Columbus landed at Santiago de Cuba in 1452 and explorers soon extended their discoveries north of that, it was mainly from the 18th century, the numbers of Europeans, coming to the New World from times of war, poverty, persecution or simple adventure began to increase.

By the 19th century, in upper Canada, now Ontario, they were making deals with the Indigenous people living on the land, to purchase it from them and draw their lines in the earth to divide it into sections for individual ownership, an idea quite alien to the people that had lived there for so many centuries.

This week, the Albion-Bolton Historical Society had a meeting to learn more about the 200th anniversary of the signing of Treaty 19, the purchase of North Peel, as presented to them by Heather Ghey Broadbent. Ms. Broadbent is a founding member of the Albion-Bolton Historical Society, now in existence since 1974. She is, as well, the former heritage officer of the Town of Caledon. "You can't put a dollar value on your safety," says Umar Uppal, owner of the Tire Junction in Bolton.

ith colder weather approaching, many motorists are already making the switch to winter tires to get ready for the season and avoid the rush when the temperature takes a plunge.

Winter tires have different treads and have a rubber compound that is softer than summer or all season tires that allow them to grip the road more efficiently - especially when snow or ice is a factor.

"This year people are avoiding the line-ups that happen in November," Mr. Uppal said. "People are coming in a little early and getting things done. Winter tires are best for when the temperature drops to ten degrees or below. Snow tires also work in the rain. They work better in the rain than a normal tire. The rubber compound is different than with a summer tire. They have a better grip. The moisture on the road can make things slippery."

Mr. Uppal has been in the tire industry for 38 years. He learned the business while living in the UK then brought his knowledge to Bolton. He opened his Bolton shop in 2008 and has been outfitting drivers in Bolton and the surrounding area ever since.

Choosing your band and type of winter tires requires some knowledge and Mr. Uppal and his staff help customers select the right type and brand for their vehicle.

"We look at where the customer lives and where they will be driving and what type of terrain they will be driving on. From that, we recommend the right tread pattern and the right type of tire for them. There will be a difference for people who do mostly rural driving and those that are commuting. Commuters don't need quite as an aggressive tire and those are a little quieter for the highway."

Mr. Uppal recommends taking the time to have your car prepared for the winter season when you have your tires installed.

"You should have all your fluids and belts checked," Mr. Uppal explained. "The wipers should be checked and your oil change done as well as a general winter inspection done on the car. It's better to have it done sooner than later."

The shop carries a huge variety of tires for all vehicles and if they don't have a particular tire in stock, they can get it and usually there will very little delay.

The auto shop at the Tire Junction is a full service facility that handles all types of repairs. They expanded the shop area last year and this year added to the number of staff to expedite service time.

However, it's also important to note that mixing new and used tires with varying wear and tread depth can significantly impact the stability and performance of both your tires and your vehicle. The best way to ensure a safe and steady drive is to install four high-quality winter tires, not two.

OVER THE PAST DECADE, automakers have been racing to bring electrification to the market as an alternative to fossil fuels and internal combustion engines. With electrification becoming more affordable and more usable, automakers are now filling their vehicles with autonomous technology and large manufacturers are investing large sums of money to put full-autonomous vehicles on the road in mass numbers. Just this past week, Honda committed \$2.75 billion to GM's Cruise, collaborating with General Motors and Cruise Automation to bring a mass-produced, fully-autono-

mous vehicle to market and public roads. Honda put \$750 million as an equity investment in the company and has committed to \$2 billion over the next 12 years. This is big news and a large win for General Motors and Cruise who currently have about 100 fully autonomous cars testing in California. GM bought Cruise Automation in 2016 and they are currently testing Chevrolet Bolts with no steering wheel or pedals, just seating for passengers. The company is looking to bring a unique vehicle out as early as next year to be used for commercial ride-hailing such as Uber or Lyft. The race for full autonomy to market is on, with Ford committing for their first vehicle by 2021 and Waymo with Pacifica vans in the next few years as well.

Another large force in the automotive industry has been electrification as well. Over the last decade, we have seen many companies bring to market fully electric cars. These have progressed and been refined significantly over the years and are now being applied to SUVs and crossovers, starting with the Tesla Model X and the recently released Jaguar I-Pace. Mercedes and Audi have now both revealed their full electric, all wheel drive crossovers that will be on market by mid-2019. The new Audi e-tron SUV is the latest from the company and a stylish offering in this segment. The model promises a long range from its 95kwh battery,



30-minute charging up to 80% from a public 150kw charger, and 0-60 in 5.5 seconds, quite quick for an SUV. Mercedes-Benz also released their all-new brand EQ and the first offering, the EQC. This new crossover from Mercedes is also all-electric with 2 motors that drive an axle each, giving the vehicle a proper 4Matic system as well as great performance and handling. Mercedes states the EQC can do 0-60 in 5.1 seconds and has a range of over 450km with fast charging available as well. Plenty of new technology also fills

this crossover with 5 different drive modes including ECO assist that tells you how to drive to optimize your charge to get you further. With the luxury automakers bringing fully-electric crossovers to market, General Motors and Ford also have stated to be bringing fully electric crossovers within the next two years, as well as brands like Jeep introducing Plug-in Hybrids on most of their line-up by 2021. The future is high-tech and here, now including the industry's strongest segment, SUVs and Crossovers.




