From 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on March 1, the Caledon Public Library (CPL), Albion Hills Community Farm (AHCF), and Palgrave United Community Kitchen (PUCK) will be hosting 'Seedy Saturday' at the Caledon East Community Complex.
