

Kinsmen organize 35th Bolton Run

The 35th annual Terry Fox Run will be held in Bolton Sept. 20.

The Kinsmen Club of Bolton has been busy getting everything in order for another successful run. Close to 100 runners, raising \$12,000, participated last year and the goal for this year is to match and improve last year's efforts. The meeting place for all participants will be at the Bolton Kinsmen Centre at 35 Chapel St. After a brief ceremony, the Run will officially start at 9 a.m. This year, a one-kilometre run route along the Humber River will be set up.
