New May programs, events and workshops

What Makes this Country Tick? is a community art project with drop-in opportunities to create. It is running May 7 from 1 to 4 p.m., with displays going from May 4 to Aug. 31.

Share your favourite symbols or images of Canada by submitting an artwork that will be part of a community art project displayed at PAMA. Create your piece at PAMA on the activity date or at home.
