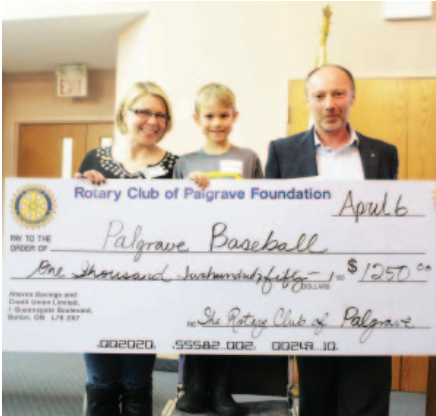


Rotary Club of Palgrave's Weekly Rotary Minute
