

Shannon Kingsbury will perform at CrossCurrents

Singer, songwriter, harpist and music educator Shannon Kingsbury will be the featured performer tomorrow (Friday) at CrossCurrents Cafe in Bolton.

Based in Guelph, her diverse performing career has included work on film soundtracks, stage and recording studios, as well as writing and producing original community based shows. She has received critical praise for her debut release Luminocity, inspiring critics to write that she has "a voice that is hard to turn away from" (Ontario); her compositions are "inspired by music centuries old and modernized and recreated to be all her own" (Echo); LuminoCity is "a world-minded collection of folksy tales surrounded by harp . . . with poignant rhythms and excellent production . . . these songs play out like a living fairy tale" (Huffington Post).
