

Simon Whitfield and Scott Thornton to be at charity game in Bolton

Seventeen years ago, Canadian Simon Whitfield won the Gold Medal in the Triathlon at the Sydney Olympics. Over his career, Whitfield went to four Olympics, won a silver in Beijing in 2008, a Gold at the 2002 Commonwealth Games and a silver at the 1999 Pan American Games. With more than 50 major victories, he became one of the all time most successful Olympians in Canada's history.

Whitfield will be inducted to the Canada Sports Hall of Fame in Toronto Nov. 9, before coming to Caledon for a Nov. 10 charity hockey game at the arena in Bolton. He will be joined by other Olympic athletes, local business people and retired NHL hockey stars like Scott Thornton, who played for several NHL teams, including Toronto Maple Leafs.

Barrie Shepley of C3 Running said the Nov. 10 game is free to everyone, but tickets must be picked up prior to the evening to ensure the event is not oversold.
