

Surveying to be discussed at historical society

Some people wonder how the local road pattern came to be laid out, and why some roads go straight, while others take weird jogs. Some of that will be explained at the next meeting of the Caledon East and District Historical Society, which will be June 26.

The speaker will be Gordon Good, chair of the archives committee of the Association of Ontario Land Surveyors. He's expected to discuss such issues as the difference between a concession and sideroad, what tools and methods surveyors used in the past, what a 'baseline' refers to, how big a lot is, etc.
