## Volunteer MBC launches new series on Rogers TV Peel

This is via a special 13-part series entitled? i care?i volunteer.?

The series began airing last week in Brampton and Mississauga. It will air in Caledon starting tomorrow (Friday) on cable channel 63.

Volunteer MBC offers a referral and matching service for volunteer placement within the community for all ages. This service can be accessed through consultation by email, in-person consultation at any one of the centre's three locations (Caledon, Brampton or Mississauga), or by searching through the centre's on-line volunteer opportunity database.
